We will have a mid-term exam and a final. If you miss one of the exams, you will be asked to withdraw.

- Frequently using Mandarin as a social language in classes and with peers.
- You may have occasional assignments; e.g. composing Mandarin version of your own short writings which could be a poem or a simple story; sharing relevant information with the class in special holidays (e.g. Chinese New Year).
