### **Class Attendance Policies:**

- If you cannot attend class due to sickness, please notify your instructor in advance if possible and submit a doctor's note when you come back to class.
- From the 5<sup>th</sup> unexcused absence, your final grade will be reduced one letter grade for each additional unexcused absence. For example, if your final grade is an A and have 5 absences, you will receive a B. If you have 6 absences, you will receive a C. Being late for classes or leaving before the class ends may be considered as half-absence.
- Students who have 8 absences are not allowed to take the final exam.

### **Testing Policies:**

- In each lesson, there will be a vocabulary quiz, an oral quiz and a test. There are no make-up quizzes or tests under any circumstances; however, at the end of the semester, the lowest quiz and test scores will be dropped.
- Both the mid-term and the final exam consist of a written and an oral section. The written sections of both exams will be given according to the schedule in the Oasis. The oral sections will be scheduled during the appointed hours of the mid-term and the final exam week, respectively.

### **Homework Assignments:**

Please note that the grades for your homework and lesson tests carry the same weight. Homework should be turned in during regular class. If you turn in homework assignment one day late, you will get maximum 5 points out of 10. Homework older than two days is not accepted.

**Oral Assessments:**

Your oral proficiency will be assessed by oral quizzes and oral practice sessions with a Korean native speaker. A 30-minute oral practice session per week with a native speaker is required. The partner should be a Korean-born native speaker who graduated from a Korean high school and lived in the US for less than 6 years.

Please find a Korean native speaker to complete this task. If you have difficulty finding a Korean native speaker, feel free to consult your instructor.
