### **Prerequisite:**

### **Course Objective:**

As a continuation of KREN 2001, this course further develops intermediate level Korean grammar, vocabulary, speaking and writing. In addition, students will learn fundamentals of Korean culture through interactive classroom activities. This course is required for all students wanting to minor in Korean.

### **Requirements:**

1. Class attendance
  - If you cannot attend class due to illness, please notify me in advance if possible and submit a doctor's note when you come back to class.
  - From the 5<sup>th</sup> unexcused absence, your final grade will be reduced one letter grade for each additional unexcused absence. For example, if your final grade is an A and have 5 absences, you will receive a B. If you have 6 absences, you will receive a C. Being late for classes or leaving before the class ends may be considered as half-absence.
2. Quizzes and tests
  - In each lesson, there will be a vocabulary quiz, an oral quiz and a lesson test. There are **no make-up quizzes or tests under any circumstances**; however, the lowest quiz and test scores will be dropped.
3. Daily homework assignments
  - If you turn in homework assignment one day late, you will get maximum 5 points out of 10. Homework older than two days is not accepted.

### **Class Participation:**

Your class participation factors into your grade. You are expected to demonstrate your preparation for the class and be actively involved in class activities.
