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 Strong expository essays show the connections between specific, concrete facts or events and broader ideas that allow us to make sense of the world.

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- Having a thesis is useful to both the writer and the reader.

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- A thesis statement is the essay's controlling idea.

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- A well formed thesis is a writer strategy; it helps you

   (a) develop and cover all parts of an assignment, (b)
   know when you are "done," and (c) stay organized
   so that you are wandering off in unrelated
   directions.
